## AWIS Financial report 2023/2024

This year AWIS recorded a loss of \$19920.

AWIS has assets of \$6151, including \$300 to be transferred from the Dunedin branch account.

As described in the convenors report covering the deficit of the conference has been the main outgoing. Conference expenses were paying the registration for the exec and two dell award winners.

The AWIS main term deposit was not reinvested, these funds have been used to cover the conference deficit.

Subscriptions were on par with previous years.

AWIS has a range of branded clothing items purchased for display, some of these were sold at the conference and the remainder has been depreciated at 20%.

AWIS sponsored a brunch in Dunedin as part of the science festival. We remain members of the NCW and RSNZ

The Dell award was produced this year to award to the 2023 winner and their attendance at the conference was supported by AWIS.

Paypal has been used to receive some subscription payments. Unfortunately these transactions do attract fees which will in future be added to the subscription invoice. The \$28 in this account will be transferred to the main BNZ account.

Sponosorship for the my story webinar series was received, and two regional events were hosted by AWIS this year. The Auckland Pink ribbon breakfast made a donation to breast cancer research and the Christchurch Ms information movie night made a small profit.

The AWIS WIS scholarship was awarded this year (see below). The admin fee was met out of the AWIS main account. The balance of the AWIS STEM account is currently \$8250.

Upcoming expenses for AWIS expected in the 2024/2025 is the reminder of the conference deficit.
